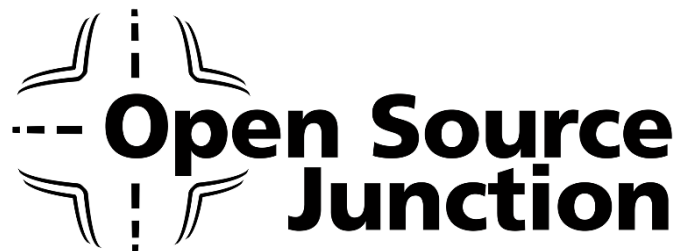

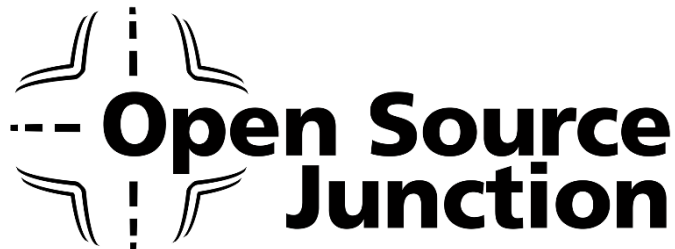

- Benefit from external participation



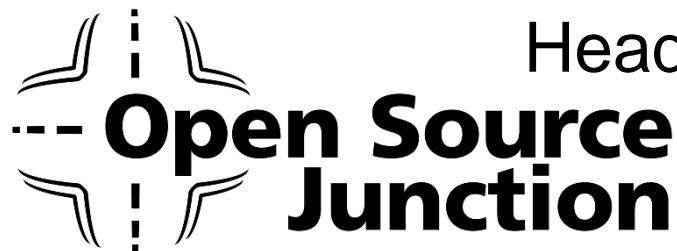


Community

Long term sustainability

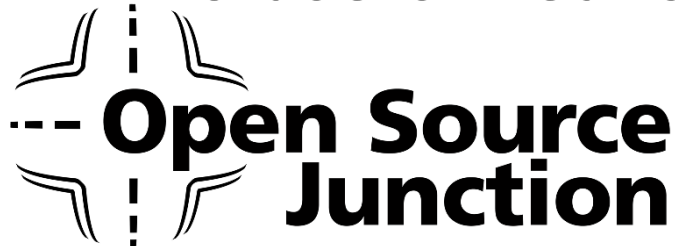
▶ It's all about the users

- no development means no future prospect of attracting users

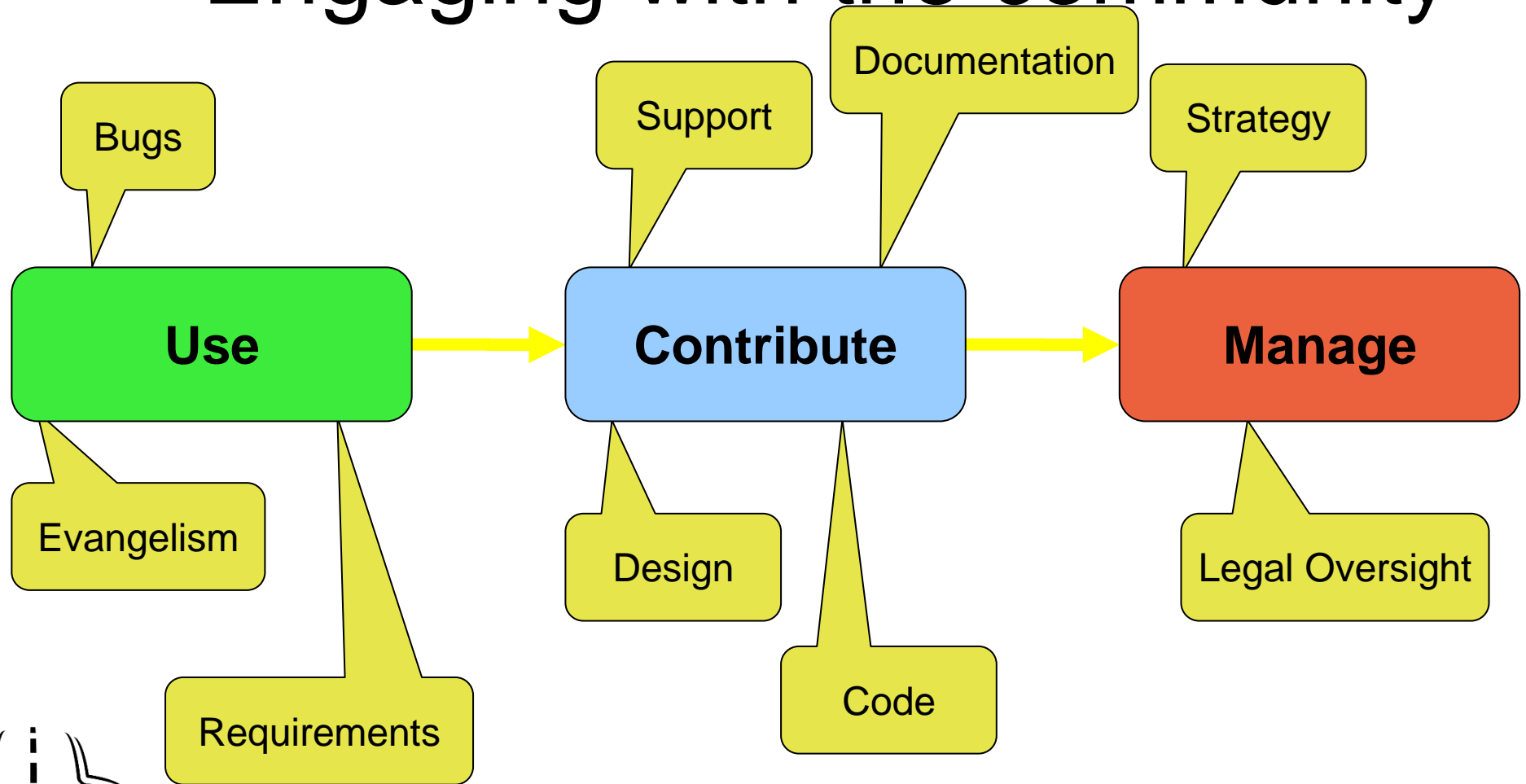
▶ No users means no business opportunities

▶ No users means no project



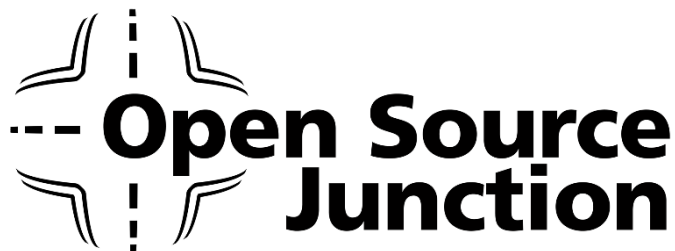
Engaging with the community





Why does this community care?

- ▶ Open source is driven by user need
 - Without user feedback the project is blind
- ▶ Assisting users ensures the user community expands
 - A large user community becomes self supporting
- ▶ Some users become contributors
- ▶ Some contributors become maintainers
